



Heathmont United Netball Club Training Supervision Policy

Purpose

Heathmont United Netball Club (HUNC) is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children in netball by providing a safe and inclusive environment and by ensuring that everyone involved in netball at HUNC is educated and informed of their responsibilities to protect and look after children.

HUNC has a zero tolerance policy to child abuse and neglect in any form.

We believe that all children have the right to feel safe and protected from all forms of abuse, harm and neglect. Children have the right to take part in sport in a safe, positive and enjoyable environment.

Guidelines

As a Netball Victoria/Australia affiliated club, HUNC complies with all Netball Victoria and Netball Australia policies including the [Netball Australia Child Safeguarding Policy](#). We are committed to ensuring this policy is adhered to by everyone involved in netball at HUNC.

In compliance with the Netball Australia Child Safeguarding Policy, **HUNC requires at least one adult, in addition to the coach, to be present at all training sessions to ensure all children are adequately supervised.** This ensures that HUNC complies with the supervision requirements under the Netball Australia Child Safeguarding Policy, that supervision is constant, active and diligent. The supervising adult must hold a valid Working with Children Check (WWCC) that has been provided to HUNC.

The supervising adult role comes under the roles and responsibilities of the Team Manager (TM), who will have already provided their WWCC to HUNC. However, if the TM is unable to fulfill this supervision role, they may have another adult from their team fulfill this role but must ensure that any adult fulfilling this role provides their WWCC to the club. The TM is responsible for ensuring that there is always an adult, with a valid WWCC that has been provided to the club, present at all training sessions.
